



NOW WHAT?



An ally acknowledges the limits of their knowledge about oppressed people's experiences but doesn't use that as a reason not to think and/or act. An ally does not remain silent but confronts oppression as it comes up daily and also seeks to deconstruct it institutionally and live in a way that challenges systemic oppression, even at the risk of experiencing some of that oppression. Being an ally entails building relationships not only with people oppressed by their identities but also with people privileged by their identities in order to challenge them in their thinking. PHILOSOPHY AND SCOPE OF PROGRAMMING

Programs at the L.E. Phillips Memorial Public Library support our strategic initiatives, collection of materials, services, resources, and facilities along with city-wide goals. CRITERIA OF SELECTION

The L.E. Phillips Memorial Public Library's materials selection policy must be flexible and broad. New acquisitions will be tested by the following standards:

- 1. Identified, expressed, or anticipated demand in the general community
- 2. Availability of titles from vendors or elsewhere in the community
- Contemporary significance, popular interest, or permanent value (Change to "Current or historical significance of the author or subject")
- Attention of critics and reviewers Extent of publicity, critical review, and current or anticipated demand.
- 5. Prominence, authority, significance, and/or competence of author or creator
- 6. Timeliness and accuracy of material including new editions of existing materials.
- 7. Relation to existing collections, such as titles in a series.
- 8. Statement of challenging, original, or alternative point of view
- 9. Authenticity of historical, regional, or social setting
- 10. Culturally and identity inclusive

10.11. Add "Online resources are also evaluated based on accessibility and the availability of library licensing



Diversity

Our definition of diversity draws from the American Library Association's articulation of diversity as "the critical need for access to library and information resources, services, and technologies by all people, especially those who may experience language or literacy-related barriers; economic distress; cultural or social isolation; physical or attitudinal barriers; racism; discrimination on the basis of appearance, ethnicity, immigrant status, religious background, sexual orientation, gender identity, gender expression; or barriers to equal education, employment, and housing" (American Library Association, 2019).





