



### APPROPRIATION

### What is cultural appropriation?

The adoption of elements of one (often minority) culture by members of another (often dominant) culture. This is harmful and offensive because it:

· Reduces a culture to a narrow stereotype

· Sexualizes, trivializes, and mocks groups of people who often face oppression and/or marginalization.

· Allows the narticipant to adopt the aspects of a culture they find appealing while ignoring the struggles of the people to whom that culture belongs.

· Removes the context that makes those cultural elements meaningful.

# What Worked

After one teen heard the group guideline to "Accept people as they are and to try your best to respect the personal pronouns others use. If you don't know how someone wanted to be addressed then respectfully ask without judgement", he knew he had found a place where he fit in. The monthly online sessions were the only time when he could sit back, relax, and talk with other kids his age who were feeling the same isolation as he was during the pandemic. The virtual events gave him something to look forward to.
