Old Business

WLA 2018 and updates for 2019 Conference (Roxane Bartelt)

- Nothing but rave reviews for YSS Luncheon Speaker
- Roxane and Claire did a lot of work coordinating in the process of planning. Claire was great.
- The process for next year is going to streamlined.
- There is no list of sponsored programs in 2018's conference booklet.
- All major speakers are booked for 2019.
- Ijeoma Oluo is next year's author keynote and will be doing a preconference event as well.
- Conference is early next year (October 8th)
- Program proposal form is getting revised.
- Friday, January 11th is the WLA Leadership Meeting.
- January 15th is the conference committee meeting.
- The WLA submission deadline is firm and will not be extended. March 1st is the potential date.
- The committee will look at proposals and work on and liaise with units.
- Membership should not submit to YSS.
- Possible poster sessions and lightning rounds for next year.
- If you have an idea for a speaker and they will cost something to bok, email Roxane. (roxane.knitter@gmail.com 262-989-2182)
 - Marge added that out of state colleagues are great options and we can give them a small amount (roughly \$100) to help them get to the conference.
- Marge added that the board is working on a statement of support on the subject of why we are going back to the Kalahari.
- The Kalahari is expanding their conference center and it is unknown whether we will be in the older section or in the new area.

Membership Survey (Linda Jerome)

- There were results for members and also non-member results, with 55 non-member responses and 71 member responses.
- History of the membership survey: in 2016, we started talking about doing a survey to understand how to recruit members and find out why people aren't members. A values statement was created. Linda chaired the process, the survey was drafted, and language was intentionally changed y to reflect library staff serving youth. Thank you for your hard work, Linda!
- Member Results:
 - Most have been in the field for 5-15 years. 81% attended a session. More promo is needed for other initiatives.
 - We should focus on getting more people to volunteer
 - More continuing education is wanted
 - They said they don't want to volunteer, but we're not sure that's the case
 - The why for membership: support, connection are the big things for yss memberships
- Non-Member Results:
 - Most are not members of WLA due to budget constraints
 - They don't necessarily feel like they are welcome or not a good fit for the org
 - Are we losing members because YSS is at the bottom of the list when they register? Rename ourselves? Or make the form easier to navigate?
 - Resources used by non-members: most selected were none or the blog
 - Are they interested in joining? For many, no.
 - Many are from small libraries
 - They want more ready made programs
- Brainstorming session on increasing membership and member interaction and engagement:
 - Offer a monthly payment for membership (Create a motion to send to the board and to Plumer.)
 - Should we get a marketing person for YSS? Anne said she could help with that
 - \circ If we get a new member, can we email them to welcome them?
 - WVLS offers a scholarship for membership. Can other systems follow that lead?
 - Can we get a promotional email to system people to send out to new staff?
 Possibly give them a framework on what to give to new staff in their system.
 - Can there be a tiered membership? \$50 is the minimum and it's scaled by salary.

It was moved that we take this discussion to the retreat!
